I. VISION

To uphold the mission and school identity, the Research Planning and Accreditation Center (RPAC) before and currently under Quality Assurance Office aims to achieve the following goals:

1. To pursue culture of excellence through varied research-related activities and programs among students and personnel.
2. To identify the issues and needs of the school community and its people that calls for immediate response.
3. To contribute and be an agent of change to local and national development needs through meaningful research programs.

4. To provide quality in the delivery of service through innovation, production, and publication of research works among students and personnel.

VI. RESEARCH AGENDA



The MCS Research Agenda presents a holistic and student-centered framework that reflects the core priorities of the institution. At its heart, it emphasizes continuous improvement in teaching, student support, leadership, and community engagement. Each area is interconnected, recognizing that quality education is shaped not only by instruction but also by assessment practices, student services, leadership systems, school culture, and external partnerships.

1. Teaching and Learning

This pillar focuses on strengthening classroom practices and ensuring that instruction is meaningful, innovative, and responsive to learners' needs. It highlights the importance of curriculum relevance, teacher competence, and learner engagement.

Effective leadership sustains institutional growth. This pillar examines governance, strategic planning, financial management, and resource allocation.

Priority research areas include:

- Strategic planning and school improvement initiatives
- Financial management and budget optimization
- Human resource development and performance evaluation systems
- Facilities management and learning environment enhancement
- Policy implementation and institutional compliance

5. School Community

A strong internal school culture fosters collaboration and shared responsibility among administrators, teachers, students, and staff. This pillar investigates the collaboration among MCS stakeholders and its community as a whole.

VII. ETHICAL STANDARDS

The integrity of research process is one the considerations of the institution. Safeguarding the right and safety of potential participants and researchers is observed. Hence, in this section, the ethical guidelines and key procedures are aligned with ethical research codes of various organizations, institutions, and Philippine law will be elaborated.

A. Guidelines:

All researchers (students/personnel) planning to do any research activity at Manila Cathedral School are expected to complete the Ethical Consideration Form, and submit it to their QA, SHS Coordinator, and HS Principal, together with their research proposal, before commencing their research activity.

The following procedures should be used as a guide to filling up the form- ***Ethical Consideration Form and Consent form:***

1. PRIVACY, CONFIDENTIALITY, AND ARCHIVE OF DOCUMENTS & INFORMATION

In compliance with Republic Act 10173 or the Data Privacy Act of 2012, it is expected that the following will be done by the researcher/s:

1.1. Participant Information Sheet

This is provided by the researcher with an approved format for completion and describes in straightforward, non-specialist language what will be done with the data collected, and the rationale for collecting the data.

1.2. Participant Consent Form

The researcher shall utilize the prescribed consent form template, but information/sections may be added/deleted depending on what applies to the study. This must be written in English and Filipino languages which are appropriate to the level of the understanding of target participants and covers the custody and preservation of data, complying with MCS Data Privacy standards and procedures. The said consent form must include the following information:

1.2.1. Information about the study and its methods (e.g., length of the research conduct; number of interview sessions (if applicable)

1.2.2. Procedures that will be undertaken by the participants;

1.2.3. Benefits after the results

1.2.4. The right to withdraw their participation in the study at any time without having to give any reasons or penalties.

1.2.5. The rights to remain anonymous throughout the study

1.2.6 Willingness to participate in the study

1.2.7 Any possible risk, or inconvenience to the participants

1.3. Parent / Guardian Consent Form

For minor participants, informed consent must be obtained from parents, or in case of their absence, a legal guardian, in accordance with applicable laws. The researcher must utilize the Consent form provided by the QA office. When supported, the child's legal guardian offers a written authorization letter for the researcher to interact with the child and use the information obtained.

1.4. Archiving of Data

The personal information gathered will only be kept for as long as is required to meet the stated, defined, and lawful purposes from the time of collection. The following must be considered in data retention:

1. Research objectives;
2. Physical copies must be stored in a safe and secure location
3. Digital files should be backed up
4. MCS drive must be utilized in storing digital data, where only the authorized MCS community is allowed to access

2. PROTECT THE ENVIRONMENT

In accordance with RA 6969 otherwise known as "Toxic Substances and Hazardous and Nuclear Wastes Control Act of 1990", it is expected that the researcher/s whose study needed substances will practice the following:

1. *The researcher/s, under the supervision of the research adviser/ supervisor, must coordinate with the Physical Facilities office, Science Department, and External partner to be informed of the waste management protocols (disposal and storage of hazardous items) and necessary precautions to ensure the safety and proper handling of chemicals.*
2. *The researcher/s have the following responsibilities:*
 - 2.1. *Wear personal protective equipment (PPE) such as a safety mask, gloves, chemical goggles, and other protective*
 - 2.2. *Label all chemical containers/glassware with the chemical composition and date when the experiment was conducted*

3. OTHER INFORMATION

1. The consent of Manila Cathedral School to conduct research does not waive the need for Ethics Committee clearance from the institutions where the investigation would be executed.
2. When preparing research, the researcher may refer to the stated ethical guidelines of any field of research organization or institution.
3. Students /researchers cannot start fieldwork unless the Research Officer/ Supervisor/Research Teacher has cleared and signed this document.

B. There are four parts to this procedure to be accomplished by the researcher(s):

- Part A: Researcher /Student's Information;
- Part B: Researcher Risks;
- Part C: Participants' Risks;

- Part D: Ethical Approval

C. The Ethics Committee is composed of the following:

- QA Officer
- Research Coordinator (for SHS Students)
- Subject Area Coordinators/Office Heads (for Personnel)
- Principal

VII. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

PLAGIARISM & GRAMMAR CHECKING

Academic honesty and respect for other people's intellectual property are values upheld by MCS. The act of duplicating another person's work and claiming it as one's own is known as plagiarism. When conducting research, it is completely immoral to claim someone else's ideas as your own. It is necessary to give credit where credit is due (APA Ethics Code Standard 8.11, Plagiarism).

A. Citation/Referencing

The MCS follows the APA (American Psychological Association) 7th edition citation and reference style in any disciplines of the research study.

B. Sanctions

A student researcher or personnel who plagiarizes will be dealt accordingly, as stipulated in:

1. Student Handbook - Students (Code of Conduct and Policies on Discipline; Major Infractions - II/G/17)

- 1st infraction- two (2) days suspension with two (2) hours Administrative/Academic service/ Guidance/ Spiritual Counseling and a grade of 75 in conduct within the semester.
- 2nd infraction - three (3) days suspension with two (2) hours of Administrative/Academic Service/ Guidance/ Spiritual Counseling and a grade of 70 in conduct within the semester and will be in probationary status within the academic year.
- 3rd infraction- four (4) days suspension or two (2) hours Administrative /Academic Service/ Guidance/ Spiritual Counseling and a grade of 70 in conduct within the semester and remain under probationary status upon enrolment in the next school year.

C. Faculty/NTP Manual - Personnel (Personnel Discipline and Administrative Penalties - Class III Offense 2.3.8)

- 1st Offense - Thirty (30) day suspension without pay
- 2nd Offense - Termination

D. Process of Grammar and Originality Checking

1. The grammar checking will be done before the final research project presentation. Likewise, the originality checking will be done before the research proposal and after the final research project presentation.
2. Researchers must use the form - R1 Originality Checking Service Form (for originality checking) and Grammar Checking Service Form (for grammar checking). They must follow the indicated instructions and requirements upon submission to the QADPC.
3. Upon approval, the QADPC Officer shall then perform the needed originality and/or grammar checking service, using online applications (Turnitin and Quillbot) within 2-3 working days.
4. If the proposal/final research project surpasses the originality and grammar criteria given, a certificate will be issued to the researchers along with the edited soft copy of the study. The certificates must be included in the APPENDIX part of the study.

E. Copyrights

Intellectual property copyrights belong to the author of the research, however, Manila Cathedral School may warrant the patents of the research conducted when it is created with substantial use of the institution’s resources and as a part of the requirement in various subjects taken.

The recommendation of the committee is still subject to the approval of the director’s council. In addition, corresponding incentives are subject to the funding for the year.
