Nevertheless, Gerick asked the coordinator for



The UniTeam, a symbol of unity and collaboration, once promised a Philippines united under a shared vision. This carefully constructed image resonated with voters weary of political division. The partnership between Marcos Jr. and Duterte, two powerful political figures, seemed to guarantee a stable and effective government. However, the recent events paint a drastically different picture. The once unified front is now showing cracks, and it is impossible to ignore the tension brewing within the highest levels of leadership, affecting members of the nation.

Moreover, the internal conflict within the administration leads to government inaction and inefficiency. A lack of unity at the highest levels of government obstructs effective governance and negatively impacts the delivery of public services. The National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA) has noted that internal political conflict can slow down critical decision-making processes, leaving issues such as economic instability, unemployment, and rising inflation largely unresolved. In a country where millions of Filipinos are still struggling to recover from the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, any delay in action can further hinder progress.


The question is: Where is the unity? The UniTeam campaign promised a unified nation, a central theme that now seems to be fading rapidly. The public deserves a clear explanation of the issues and a demonstration of the leadership needed to overcome this crisis. The President and Vice President must prioritize national needs over personal differences and work to restore the trust and unity they promised. Failure to do so will damage their political standing and undermine the stability and progress of the Philippines. According to a report from ABS-CBN News, the growing political divide between the two is becoming a source of frustration for many Filipinos who believed in the "team" that would unify the country.

Take, for example, the administration of former President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo. During her campaign, she promised to fight corruption and ensure the welfare of the Filipino people. However, once in office, Arroyo's presidency was marred by allegations of corruption, leading to widespread protests and a loss of trust in the government. Similarly, former President Joseph Estrada made grand promises of fighting poverty and corruption but was soon embroiled in scandal and ousted from office in the 2001 People Power Revolution. These incidents, like Marcos and Duterte's current feud, highlight how easily political leaders can break their campaign promises once they are securely in power.

This pattern of broken promises has serious consequences for the Filipino people. The public trust in the government erodes, and people become more cynical about the political system. According to a Pulse Asia survey, public satisfaction with the government has dropped sharply, with only 56% of Filipinos expressing approval of the administration in late 2024. This drop can be attributed, in part, to the growing perception that the President and Vice President are not working together for the nation's benefit. In the past, the Philippines has seen the impact of such clownery. For example, during the 2000s, political instability and public dissatisfaction contributed to economic stagnation, with the country's GDP growth rate struggling to keep pace with its Southeast Asian neighbors. This history of broken promises and resulting discontent can only serve as a warning for what might happen if the current leadership continues down this path.

The nation's future rests on their ability to reconcile their differences and rebuild their fractured UniTeam foundation. In a country that faces economic instability, poverty, and political division, strong leadership is more than ever.

Over the years, the usage of e-cigarettes has affected millions of people around the world. In the Philippines, an alarming 2.7 million Filipinos use e-cigarettes or vapes, according to the Department of Health (DOH). Based on the Global Youth Tobacco Survey (GYTS), about 14.1 percent of these users are students. Disturbingly, reports indicate that some Filipino vapers are as young as 10 years old, highlighting the failure of regulations meant to keep these products out of minors' hands.

One of the main reasons minors can vape is its easy accessibility. Vape shops, despite existing laws, often turn a blind eye to age restrictions, prioritizing profit over public health. The Vape Law (Republic Act No. 11900) was enacted to regulate the sale of vapes, setting the minimum age at 18. However, many stores do not enforce this rule, and online platforms make it even easier for minors to obtain these products. This lax enforcement allows peer pressure to thrive. Many teenagers start vaping due to influence from friends, wanting to fit in or satisfy their curiosity. Seeing their peers casually using vapes, even inside school premises, makes the habit seem harmless. In some cases, minors turn to vaping as a form of escape, seeking relief from family conflicts, academic pressure, or personal struggles.

The dangers of vaping among minors go beyond just social influences, but also it presents serious health risks. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), e-cigarettes contain harmful substances such as nicotine, volatile organic compounds, and heavy metals like lead, which can severely damage the lungs and brain. Nicotine addiction in adolescents affects brain development, leading to difficulties in learning, memory retention, and impulse control. The American Lung Association also warns that vaping can cause respiratory illnesses, increase the risk of heart disease, and lead to a lifelong dependency on nicotine.

Gambling is the practice or activity of betting or the practice of risking money or other stakes in a game or bet, such as commercial games, number games, instant lotteries, sports betting, etc. However, in the Philippines, online gambling has been rising and becoming famous among people, as it has existed since the 16th century and has been evolving and improving in the modern era. 

Companies collaborating with vloggers and celebrities have amplified the reach of these games, luring even more unsuspecting victims.

As the economy depends on the circulation of money, online gambling presents both an opportunity and a threat. While it does generate revenue, it also drains the finances of countless individuals. Regulatory bodies, like the Philippine Amusement and Gaming Corporation (PAGCOR), have attempted to oversee the industry, but gaps remain. Without stringent legal enforcement, online gambling becomes a breeding ground for corruption, crime, and money laundering, further destabilizing an already fragile economy.

Nonetheless, online gambling can lead a simple betting game into a monstrous addiction that one cannot escape. Like a mouse trapped with no way out, gamblers spiral into debt, fear, and anxiety, desperate for another win that may never come. The constant psychological stress creates a vicious cycle, pushing individuals into deeper despair. The mental health crisis tied to gambling addiction remains largely ignored, yet its impact is evident in the growing number of Filipinos facing severe financial distress and family breakdowns.

One of the greatest enablers of this addiction is social media promotion. Vloggers and celebrities, motivated by sponsorships, recklessly promote these platforms without regard for the consequences. In doing so, they become part of the mechanism that sets the trap, glamorizing gambling and making it appear as an easy path to success. According to a study by the University of the Philippines, social media endorsements significantly increase the likelihood of younger audiences engaging in gambling activities. Influencers create an illusion of wealth and success, showing off their supposed winnings while hiding the reality of devastating losses.

Like a mouse eyeing a tempting piece of deadly cheese, many Filipinos continue to fall for the illusion of easy wealth. When will we recognize the trap for what it truly is? Until the government and the people take a stand against this exploitative industry, the cycle of addiction and financial ruin will only persist, claiming more victims in its unrelenting grip.

Electronic Cigarettes

In the Philippines, the rise of respiratory illnesses linked to vaping has been a growing concern. The Philippine Pediatric Society (PPS) has issued warnings about the dangers of early nicotine exposure, citing cases of minors developing lung injuries and persistent coughs. A study by the National Institutes of Health (NIH) even found that e-cigarette users are at higher risk of developing bronchitis and pneumonia, conditions that can be life-threatening, especially for young users. Yet despite these findings, vaping continues to be glamorized on social media and among peer groups.

To curb this crisis, vape shops that sell to minors should face heavier penalties, and online platforms should require stringent age verification processes. Schools should reinforce anti-vaping campaigns, educating students about the long-term consequences of vaping. Meanwhile, parents play a crucial role in monitoring their children's behavior, ensuring that they are not influenced by harmful trends.

In addition, the government must take decisive action by addressing loopholes in existing regulations. The DOH and the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) have repeatedly urged for tighter control over flavored vapes, which are specifically designed to attract younger users. A study by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) found that over 80% of teen vapers prefer flavored e-cigarettes, proving that these products are directly targeting younger demographics. Without immediate action, the number of underage vapers in the Philippines will only continue to rise. It is time for the government, schools, parents, and society as a whole to take responsibility and protect the youth from this growing electronic epidemic.

Panahon na para maging mapanuri. Hindi lahat ng sikat ay karapat-dapat, at hindi lahat ng nagsasabing "para sa bayan" ay totoo ang intensyon. Tayo ang may kapangyarihan, at ang ating boto ang magpapasya kung ano ang mangyayari sa ating kinatatayuang bayan.

Sa bawat Overseas Filipino Worker (OFW) na umaalis ng Pilipinas, mayroong pangarap na nais tuparin, pamilya na gustong malangag sa kahirapan, at pangakong babalik nang matagumpay. Ngunit sa kabilang banda, may isa ring nakadidismayang katotohanang pilit itinatago—hindi lahat ng lumalabas ng bansa ay nakakaauwing buo, ligtas, at malaya. Ang kaso ni Mary Jane Veloso ay isang salamin ng trahedyang paulit-ulit na sinasapit ng mga Pilipino sa isang bansa na itinuturing ang kaniyang mamamayan bilang "bagong bayani," ngunit hinahayaang maging biktima ng isang marahas at mapagsamantalang sistema.

Ayon sa Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), humigit-kumulang dalawang milyong Pilipino ang nagtrabaho sa ibang bansa, beterano man o bagong pasok pa lamang. Ito ay patunay ng patuloy na pag-asa ng mga Pilipino sa overseas employment bilang solusyon sa kawalan ng oportunidad sa loob ng bansa. Subalit, ayon sa Commission on Human Rights (CHR), ang ganitong sitwasyon ay naglalagay sa mga manggagawa sa mas mataas na panganib ng human trafficking, pang-aabuso, at maling paratang, tulad ng nangyari kay Veloso.

Kung babalikan, si Veloso ay naaresto sa Indonesia noong Abril 25, 2010 matapos matagpuang may dalang 2.6 kilo ng heroin sa kaniyang maleta. Hinatulan ang Pilipina ng kamatayan at napabilang sa death row, sa kabila ng kaniyang pahayag na siya ay biktima ng human trafficking. Patunay lamang ito na ang mga OFW, na naglalakbay upang maghanap ng mas magandang buhay, ay nahaharap sa masalimuot na sitwasyon na dulot ng kakulangan ng proteksyon at masusing pag-iingat mula sa mga aw-toridad.

Sa loob ng 14 na taon, nanatiling nakakulong si Veloso sa bansang hindi sa kaniya upang parusahan para sa kasalananang hindi rin sa kanya. Noong 2015, sa huling sandali bago ang nakatakdang pagbitay, nabigyan ito ng reprieve o pagkansela ng kaparusahan matapos ang matinding apela mula sa gobyerno ng Pilipinas at mga grupong pangkarapatanang pantao. Ayon sa Department of Justice (DOJ), ang reprieve na ito ay nagbigay-daan upang masusing imbestigahan ang kaso ng OFW at ang posibilidad na siya nga ay isang biktima ng human trafficking.

Nito lamang Disyembre 2024, matapos ang matagal na negosasyon sa pagitan ng gobyerno ng Pilipinas at Indonesia, pinayagan si Veloso na makabalik sa bansa upang ipagpatuloy ang sentensya nito. Sa ilan, ang kaniyang pagbabalik ay isang simbolo ng tagumpay ng diplomasya. Ngunit sa marami, isa rin itong patunay ng kabiguan ng sistemang nagtutulak sa mga Pilipino sa bingit ng kamatayan.

Ayon sa isang ulat ng Philippine Center for Investigative Journalism (PCIJ), karamihan sa mga nahuuhuling mga drug courier sa Southeast Asia ay mula sa mahihirap na bansa, kung saan ang mga biktima ay madaling malinlang ng mga illegal recruiter at human trafficker. Ngunit ang masakit na katotohanan ay, kung mayroong matinong trabaho sa Pilipinas—isang trabahong may sapat na sahod, benepisyo, at dignidad—kakailanganin pa kaya ni Mary Jane Veloso at milyun-milyong iba pang Pilipino na makipagsapalaran sa ibang bansa?

Higit pa rito, ang kaso ni Veloso ay nagsisilbing babala. Ayon sa Department of Migrant Workers (DMW), may dosedosenang Pilipino ang kasalukuyang nasa death row o nahaharap sa mabibigat na kaso sa ibang bansa. Hindi lamang si Veloso ang nasa panganib—marami pang iba ang hindi natin kilala, hindi natin napapansin, at maaaring hindi na natin maabutan bago maging huli ang lahat.

Isang bansa ang Pilipinas na ipinagmamalaki ang kontribusyon ng mga OFW sa ekonomiya, ngunit sa oras na sila ay maipit sa panganib, biglang nagiging tahimik ang gobyerno. Maituturing na isang malaking kabalintunaan na ang bansang ito ay umaasa sa ambag ng mga makabagong bayaning ito sa ating ekonomiya ngunit hindi man lang naglaalan ng sapat na proteksyon para sa kanila.

Hindi na natin maaaring ipagpaliban pa ang pagbabago. Hindi na natin pwedeng gawing kaso lamang at pang-dagdag-datos ng mga buhay ng ating kababayan. Ang pagbabaw ng pangalan na naglalakbay ng lung-boses na ay mga isang naghahanap ng katarungan. Ilan pang pagdang-nak ng dugo ang kailangan para sa inaasam na dolyar ng mga dayuhan?

“Salamin salamin sa dingding, sino ang pinakamaganda sa buong daigdig?”

Sa panahon na pakinisan at paputian ang labanan sa larangan ng kagandahan, hindi maipagkakailang marami ang nahuhulog sa patibong ng umuusbong na mga produktong nangangakong mala-Snow White na kutis and hatid. Sino nga ba ang hindi magnanais na makamit ang pamantayang itinakda ng lipunan lalo na sa mga kababaihang likas na kayumanggi ang balat na kinagisnan? Subalit, ano ang kaya mong gawin para sa porsenalang kutis? Handa ka bang isakrisyo ang iyong kalusugan alang-alang sa kagandahan?

Isa ang intravenous (IV) glutathione sa pinakasikat na ginagamit ng mga nagnanais magpakinis at magpaputi ng balat ngunit sa likod ng makintab na alok ng mga estetikong klinika, tiyak na panganib ang kaakibat ng bawat tusok ng karayom mula rito. Sa katunayan, muling nagpaalala ang Philippine Dermatological Society nitong ika-27 ng Enero, 2025 na hindi aprubado ng Food and Drug Administration (FDA) ang paggamit ng IV Glutathione bilang pampaputi ng balat. Hindi na mabilang sa daliri ang dami ng mga seryosong babala mula sa mga eksperto upang matigil ang paggamit nito ngunit patuloy pa rin ang paglago ng produktong IV glutathione sa merkado.

Itinuturing ang glutathione bilang “mother of all antioxidants” dahil ito ang isa sa pinaka-aktibong uri ng antioxidant sa katawan na maaaring makapagpabalag sa proseso ng pagtanda ng itsura. Napapaputi nito ang balat sa pamamagitan ng pagpapahinal sa produksyon ng melanin sa ating balat na nagbibigay ng kayumanggi na kulay. Kaya naman, hindi nakapagtataka na marami ang nahuhumaling sa hatid nitong pampabata. Subalit, nagagawa lamang nitong magpaputi ng balat matapos ang maraming beses na paggamit sa gamot, malinaw na senyales na anumang labis ay masama.

Bukod pa rito, ayon sa pag-aaral ng mga eksperto, hindi sapat ang klinikal na pagsusuring nagpapatunay na epektibo ang IV glutathione bilang pampaputi dahil orihinal na layunin ng gamot na palakasin ang resistensya ng katawan at paunlarin ang kabuuang kalusugan ng isang indibidwal. Bilang karagdan, aprubado lamang ng FDA ang paggamit ng IV glutathione sa mga pasyenteng mayroong cancer, bilang gamot na nagsisilbing pansamantalang lunas sa masamang epekto ng chemotherapy.

Hindi sang-ayon ang ahensya sa paggamit nito bilang pampaputi dahil sa posible nitong masamang epekto sa kalusugan kung saan maaaring maapektuhan ang liver, kidney, at nervous system. Maaari ring magresulta ang lubusang paggamit ng IV glutathione sa Stevens-Johnson syndrome, isang malubhang kondisyon na nagdudulot ng masasakit at malalaking paltos sa balat. Kung kaya't sa halip na makinis at maputing balat ang makamit, maaari pang mapakamot sa ulo dahil sa kaakibat nitong problema sa kutis.

Mahalaga rin na maisagawa lamang ng kwalipikadong eksperto sa malinis na pasilidad ang IV glutathione dahil ang maling paraan ng pag-inject nito ay maaaring magdulot ng impeksyon tulad ng HIV at Hepatitis. Malinaw na indikasyon ng panganib na bitbit ng gamot ang sumikat na bidyo ng isang babae ng nagkaroon ng impeksyon posibleng dahil sa paggamit nito. Sa bidyo, hindi mabuksan ng babae ang kaniyang mata matapos isagawa IV Glutathione treatment kaya naman sinisi niya ang nars na ayon sa kaniya ay hindi wastong pamamaraan ang ginamit.

Kahindik-hindik masaksihan ang lantarang pagmamaniplula sa isipan ng bawat Pilipinong ipinanganak na kayumanggi, upang madagdagan ang barya sa balsa ng mga kapitalistang walang ibang hiling kundi ginto kahit kalusugan pa ng iba ang kapalit. Oras na upang putulin ang naghaharing paniniwala hinggil sa walang saysay na pamantayan ng kagandahang nakabase sa kulay ng kutis. Porselana man o morena, walang dapat mamroblema sa balat ng sinuman dahil kailanman hindi rito matatagpuan ang kahulugan ng kagandahan.

Bilang mga mamimili, mahalaga rin na maging maingat at responsible sa bawat produktong binibili lalo na't hindi lahat ng mabilisang solusyon ay ligtas para sa kalusugan. Kung mala-Snow White na kutis and nais, mainam na magpatingin muna sa mga eksperto, tiyakin kung ano ang nararapat na gawin at mag-ingat sa mga produktong hindi aprubado. Kaliwat kanan na ang paalala ng mga eksperto kaya naman tigilan na ang tigas ng kokote at pikit-matang pag-aalay ng buhay sa ngalan ng kagandahan. Wakasan na ang paggamit ng karayom upang mapatalas ang talim at pinsala na hatid ng IV glutathione sa katawan. Higit sa lahat, tandaan na hindi mahahanap sa repleksyon ng salamin ang gandang habol abutin.

Click here, click there—many are quick to jump on the bandwagon to feel a sense of belonging within the society—often at their own expense. In this digital age where social media is on the edge of becoming a drug, its pervasive influence can blur the line between what's appropriate to broadcast or what should remain private. Instagram by Meta's new location-sharing feature that launched just this month of January, 2025 is a case in point.

The particular feature called "Friend Map" was discovered after Filipino users received notifications of friends' and followers' active locations. This can be accessed through the "Messages" tab next to where users can share "Notes" on the top part. The update allows the user to zoom in on the map to view others' precise location. According to the application, users may pick whose followers have access to their data through the "Close Friends" tab or a stricter selection. Each time the user opens Instagram, the exact location is updated. However, users can also choose to activate "Invisible Mode" to hide their location. Thankfully, this feature is completely optional, but can easily be abused.

The fact that it can be turned off is evident; however, the problem lies in the lack of education about digital privacy and its long-term consequences. Based on statistics, a substantial portion of Instagram's user base are minors aged 13 and above who don't look at things the same way adults do regarding the many layers of online privacy—not just on Instagram, but everywhere. There are undeniable adverse effects once privacy is reduced to a simple on-and-off switch. Teenagers and adults have distinct awareness issues, and this is demonstrated by the fact that social media applications are constitutionally restricted to a specific age.

As social media platforms foster an insatiable craving for validation and instant gratification, many users—especially young ones—are constantly being pushed to share beyond what's necessary for the sake of clout or approval. Hence, despite Instagram being youth-oriented like many other social media softwares, location-sharing always holds risk, particularly for their female users, opening gateways to cyberstalking and multiple privacy issues.

Although practically every app is aware of their users' location, the fact remains that there is a key distinction between the intention of data collection for targeted marketing and the intentions of individuals with more personal or malicious motives. One may be tracking data to improve the applications' algorithm, allowing users to feel more entertained while scrolling through their feed, one may be a stranger who wants to initiate unwanted encounters or full-blown stalk others. The difference between the two might be pushing the envelope but it reveals the ugly truth of the digital world's reality.

To add fuel to the fire, the update is often described as 'creepy', 'too much' and 'scary' by Filipino netizens—specifically those with accounts that are mutuals with people they don't personally know raising concern at the prospect of disclosing their exact location to said mutuals, possibly compromising their own safety.

"Hi Moots [mutuals]. Just a PSA ...you are sharing your EXACT location in IG's new update... I can zoom in and know where you are ... you might be compromising your location to your followers in IG," a user voiced out on the online platform X while many others deemed it 'creepy' and bothered them. "Ok, my IG moots suddenly shared all their location[s], like, literal addresses... I have to let all of them know to turn [the] location off. That's scary coz they were not aware their location was shared PUBLICLY!!!" wrote another netizen.

Moreover, according to reports, a live test of the contentious "Friend Map" feature was first introduced last year in the United States where it quickly raised concerns, even calling the attention of several American politicians. In light of this, Congresswoman Kathy Castor and Lori Trahan wrote to Instagram, saying, "the public dissemination of that information exposes young users to additional surveillance, violence, and unsolicited interactions." As a response, Meta rebutted, stating that safety precautions were considered before a wider release of the service. This dispute indicates the sensitivity of the issue as the public continue to express their worry, it's important to prove that their so-called precautions are truly effective in addressing emerging threats.

As concerns flood the online community, technology companies must take a hard look at the consequences of their latest developing features and ensure that the safety of their users is prioritized over profit-driven convenience. This viral issue also serves as a wake-up call for all to unplug from the matrix and log in back to reality where privacy is not just an afterthought. In a world where digital privacy is becoming a blurred line, realizing that some things—like our location—are better left undisclosed to err on the side of caution. Sometimes, hitting the refresh button and not catching the buzz on the newest features may just open the road to happiness formed by genuine connections.

Malinaw na senyales ng kapalpakan ang patuloy na pagtaas ng kaso ng dengue sa bansa matapos lumipas ang mahigit pitong dekada mula nang unang maitala ang sakit sa Pilipinas. Sa kabila ng tuntuning kasalukuyang sinusunod upang maiwasan ang sakit, libo-libong buhay pa rin kada taon ang binabantaan ng dengue. Kung kaya't higit na nakababahala ang pagsawalang-bahala sa hinaing ng mga eksperto hinggil sa kakulangan ng epektibong aksyon laban sa sakit na bitbit ay panganib.

Batay sa datos ng Department of Health (DOH), tumaas ng 81% ang naitalang kaso ng dengue mula Enero hanggang Nobyembre ngayong 2024 kumpara sa parehas na buwan noong nakaraang taon. Sa panahong ito, umabot sa nakaalarmang 340,860 na buhay ang nalagay sa panganib dulot ng dengue. Kung ikukumpara sa 188,574 na bilang noong 2023, hindi maipagkakaila na dapat mabigyang-pansin ang patuloy na paglobo ng kaso ng sakit lalo na't malaking dagok ang dulot nito hindi lamang sa kalusugan ng publiko kundi pati sa kanilang bulsa.

Dulot ng bahagdan na ito ang pangunguna ng Pilipinas sa Southeast Asia bilang bansang may pinakamataas na kaso at pagkamatay dahil sa dengue. Sa katunayan, ang Pilipinas ang unang bansa sa ASEAN na nagtala ng kaso ng dengue ngunit hanggang ngayon ay walang humpay ang paglaganap ng sakit sa bansa. Nangangahulugan itong mayroon nang kakulangan sa sistema na nararapat lamang mapunan nang sa gayon ay imbes na taumbayan ang mabawasan, ang sakit na lamang ang humupay.

Isa sa kapansin-pansing kakulangan ng bansa pagdating sa laban kontra dengue ay ang kawalan ng aprubadong bakuna na magagamit bilang pansangga sa sakit. Matatandaan ang kaguluhang dulot ng kontrobersya ukol sa paggamit ng tanging bakuna na naipamahagi sa bansa laban sa dengue na Dengvaxia. Matapos ipatigil ng Food and Drug Administration (FDA) ang pamamahagi rito ay hindi na natanaw ang aktibong aksyon hinggil sa susunod na bakunang maaaring panlaban sa sakit samantalang ang karatig na mga bansa tulad ng Thailand, Malaysia, Indonesia, at Vietnam ay mayroon nang ibang klase ng bakuna kontra dengue. Kaya naman, hanggang ngayon ay walang usad ang Pilipinas sa pakikibaka sa virus na walang humpay ang pagkalat.

Nakadidismayang isipin na sa kabila ng walang tigil na pag-angat ng bahagdan sa kaso ng dengue sa bansa kung saan libo-libong indibidwal ang nagdurusa, pilit pa ring isinusubo sa publiko ang lumang pamantayan habang pikit-mata sa panibagong aksyong hiling ng karamihan. Sa bawat balitang inilalathala tungkol sa dengue, nakaririndi ang patuloy na pagdiin sa 5s kontra dengue na Search and Destroy, Self-Protection, Seek Early Consultation, Support Fogging, at Sustain Hydration. Bagaman wasto at nakatutulong ang kampanyang ito, hindi maipagkakailang hindi ito sapat upang mapababa ang porsyento ng kaso ng sakit. Indikasyon ang kasalukuyang datos na nararapat nang maglatag ng panibagong solusyon dahil walang saysay ang lunas na hatid ng kampanyang isinusulong ng pamahalaan kung wala itong kaakibat na hustong suporta.

Bilang tugon sa kalbaryo ng mga Pilipino, iminungkahi ng mga eksperto ang epektibong pag-iwas sa mga lamok na maaaring magdulot ng dengue, pagkakaroon ng wastong vaccination programs, at malawakang edukasyon sa komunidad upang maiwasan ang paglobo ng kaso ng sakit sa bansa. Sa panayam naman ng Inquirer kay Dr. Florentina Ty, dating pangulo ng Philippine Pediatrics Society (PPS), inirekomendang tularan at isagawa sa Pilipinas ang paraan ng paglaban sa dengue ng ibang bansa. "Achieving zero dengue deaths by 2030 is possible if we work together—other countries have done it" anyi. Kaliwat kanan na ang payo ng mga eksperto upang maagapan ang lumalalim na isyu kontra dengue ngunit kahit saang anggulo, hindi madama ang pagbabago.

Kalunos-lunos isipin kung ilan pa bang buhay ang dapat ialay upang umaksyon ang dapat umaksyon. Sa halip na kumilos lamang tuwing nagkakaroon ng malalang outbreak ang dengue, nararapat lamang na tiyaking patuloy na isinusulong ang mga paraan upang tuluyang mapuksa ang sakit. Hindi kailanman matutuldukan ng simpleng pamamahagi ng tuntunin ang giyera kontra dengue. Imbis na magkibit-balikat sa sigaw ng mga eksperto, nararapat lamang na pakinggan ang kanilang mungkahing solusyon. Paunlarin ang umaalingasaw na kabulukan sa sistema ng kalusugan sa bansa. Huwag putulin ang boses ng mga mamamayang higit na maalam tungkol sa sakit kumpara sa mga nakaupo nang sa gayon ay hindi na makagat ng peligro ang buhay ng mga Pilipino.

SciMath Olympics:

Mga Estudyanteng Nagtagisan sa Laban ng Talino at Lakas ng Pagtutulungan!

Sa SciMath Olympics, mga mag-aaral ang nagtutunggalian sa mga paligsahan na nagpapakita ng kanilang husay sa agham at matematika. Ito ay isang pagkakataon para sa kanila na magpakita ng kanilang talino at kakayahan sa mga hamon na nangangailangan ng kritikal na pag-iisip at pakikipagtulungan. Bawat taon, ang mga kabataan mula sa iba't ibang paaralan ay sumasali sa mga paligsahan tulad ng Crack the Code, Tangram, Sudoku, at Tower of Hanoi, na nagmumula sa kanilang kasanayan sa agham at matematika pati na rin sa kanilang abilidad sa pagtutulungan.

Sa Crack the Code, kinakailangan ang mabilis na pag-iisip at maayos na lohika upang malutas ang serye ng mga palapisipan na may kinalaman sa numerikal o lohikal na pahiwatig. Mahalaga ang papel ng pagtutulungan dito, kung saan bawat miyembro ng koponan ay may mahalagang bahagi sa pagsagot sa mga palapisipan. Sa Tangram naman, sinusubok ang spatial reasoning at ang kasanayan ng mga kalahok sa pagplano at pagsuri ng mga piraso upang makabuo ng tiyak na larawan. Ang Sudoku ay isang sikat na laro sa Math Olympics na nagtetest sa kakayahan ng mga kalahok sa pagsasaayos ng mga numero sa isang puzzle.

Ang mga kalahok ay hindi lamang maghahanap ng solusyon kundi maghahanap din ng pinaka-epektibong paraan ng paglutas, gamit ang mga hakbang na magkakasunod at hindi magkakaroon ng pagkakamali.

“Masaya and grateful ako na naging bahagi ako ng Sci-Math Olympics. isang magandang experience rin ito sa akin since ito yung first time kong

Sci-Math Olympics” ayon kay Angelo Sambayon, mag-aaral mula sa baitang II ABM.

“May halong kaba at pagkasabik —kinakabahan ako dahil hindi ko pa talaga alam kung ano ang eksaktong mga gagawin, kasi unang beses ko pa lang sasali roon. Ngunit may pagkasabik din, dahil naririnig kong masaya raw ang mga gawain, lalo na't pagtutulungan daw namin ang pagsasagot sa mga ito.”, saad ni Gian Sairiz Santiago, mag-aaral mula sa baitang II STEM.

Hindi rin mawawala ang isang klasiko na laro sa mga kompetisyon ng math olympics: ang Tower of Hanoi. Ang larong ito ay nagsusubok sa lohikal na pag-iisip at pagpapalano. Binubuo ito ng tatlong poste at ilang mga disk na may magkakaibang sukat. Ang layunin ng laro ay mailipat ang lahat ng disk mula sa isang poste patungo sa isa pa, ngunit may mga patakaran na kailangang sundin.

Sa kabuuan, ang Science at Math Olympics ay isang platform na hindi lamang nakatutok sa pagpapakita ng mga indibidwal na kasanayan kundi pati na rin sa pagpapalakas ng samahan at pagkakaisa sa loob ng mga koponan. Sa pamamagitan ng pagtutulungan at pagsasanay, ang mga kalahok ay nagkakaroon ng pagkakataon na magtagumpay, hindi lamang sa kompetisyon, kundi pati na rin sa pagpapalawak ng kanilang mga kasanayan sa pag-iisip at problem-solving. Ang mga ganitong kaganapan ay tunay na nagiging instrumento sa pagpapalaganap ng kahalagahan ng agham at matematika sa mga kabataan.

MCSian Lifts Silver for MCS at 2024 Powerlifting Championship

In the world of strength sports, some athletes redefine limits, push boundaries, and inspire a new generation. It wasn't Gold but the student and powerlifter Sonlie Dave N. Magaspac grade 11 Humss student from Manilla Cathedral School made MCS history at the 2024 Luzon Equipped Powerlifting championships, on November 9 last year.

Competing in the Men's High School U83KG and Men's Sub-Jr U83KG categories, Sonlie clinched 2nd place overall (Silver) and set new High School National Records in the Squat and Bench Press. His 455kg total came from an impressive 180kg squat, 82.5kg bench press, and 192.5kg deadlift—a showcase of sheer power and dedication.

"I'm built for squats," he says with confidence. "My femur length makes it easier to lift heavy loads."

Sonlie recalls his coach Angelo Miguel Cabrera from the Powerlifting Association of the Philippines (PAP). Cabrera also known as "fake junior" by his students is known for his strictness and realistic way of teaching and guiding. Magaspac shows great admiration for his coach Cabrera's support.

He admits that during the second lift of his event the Bench press he experienced doubt and He's more confident in other lifts in the event, especially squats.

"The bench press is super technical," Sonlie shares. "One small mistake in technique can make or break the lift."

The HUMSS student took 12 weeks to reach his peak physique for the said competition. When asked who he was looking out for it was the Gold medalist from the same event Jian Carlos Medina Senior high school student from De La Salle University.

"Kinakabahan ako, I don't think I can reach him just yet maybe next year? Pero, I'm just trying"

After this powerlifting season, he plans to switch to bodybuilding to focus on muscle growth and physique. He believes strength athletes need muscle mass, and this phase will help him "develop a more well-rounded physique" before returning to competitive lifting. Next on his list aiming for a golden podium, he will be competing at the 2025 Raw Nationals, on February 21.


